


Proposed merger between City College Brighton and Hove and Northbrook College Sussex

# **CONSULTATION DOCUMENT**

## **OUR PROPOSAL TO MERGE**

The Corporations of Northbrook College, Sussex and City College Brighton & Hove are proposing to merge. The merger would create a single institution providing the highest quality further and higher education for local people across our region. The merged College would continue to operate from across its five campuses in east Brighton, central Brighton, Shoreham and central and west Worthing.

The merger is a coming together of equals: two strong colleges combining with a fresh vision. To reflect that vision we are proposing to create a new institution provisionally called The Metropolitan College. Existing names and identities may continue to be used in local settings. Your views on the new name are sought as part of this consultation.

It is proposed that the two colleges will merge through the dissolution of the Governing Body of City College Brighton and Hove, and the transfer of its assets and liabilities to Northbrook College. The planned date of this legal transfer is 31 March 2017. Students who have not completed their courses of study by the date of the proposed merger will continue to complete their studies in their current location with the new college.

The new college will be run by one Board of Governors and one executive team, with efficiencies achieved through combining some administrative functions.

This proposal document explains the vision and rationale for the merger and in particular how it will improve the future range and quality of further and higher education in the Greater Brighton region (Brighton and Hove, Adur and Worthing). Your views are sought on these proposals as part of a transparent consultation process which is open to all.

### WHO WE ARE





#### **Northbrook College**

Northbrook College is a General Further Education College based on three campuses in Shoreham, Worthing and West Durrington. It is a Mixed Economy College with substantial HE and Apprenticeship provision, alongside full and part time vocational courses for young people and adults.

The College has 800+ undergraduates, predominantly in the Creative and Engineering sectors and 100+ Higher Apprenticeships in the Care sector. It also educates 1500 16-18 year olds, 1800 apprentices, and 6000 adults each year offering progression from entry level through to level 3 in a range of subjects linked to local and regional employment sectors with 96% going on to higher study, apprenticeships or employment. Northbrook works with over 3000 employers across the region.

The College was graded as 'good with outstanding features' by Ofsted, and received commendations from QAA for enhancement of student learning opportunities in its recent HE Review. Northbrook was the third in the country for overall student achievement in 2014/15. The College has impressive new campuses featuring industry standard workshops, studios and equipment. It also houses and jointly runs an incubation unit - The Sphere - with the Adur and Worthing Chamber of Commerce.

Northbrook College was awarded Beacon Status for its work with employers and has good financial health.



#### City College Brighton and Hove

City College is a General Further Education college based at two campuses, in the centre and east of the City. The College is in the process of building a new construction centre at its East Campus, to house all of its trades provision in state-of-the-art facilities.

CCBH offers a broad vocational provision to its immediate community of Brighton and Hove, and beyond. The College has 2000 full-time 16-18 students; 1200 full-time adults; 300 higher education students; nearly 4000 adult students on part-time programmes; 700 apprentices, and a growing number of international students.

In its most recent Ofsted inspection, City College was graded as 'good with outstanding features'. City College has also received a positive assessment in a 2016 inspection of its undergraduate courses, by the QAA. Student achievement at City College is consistently above national average. GCSE Maths and English results in summer 2015 were the highest achieved by any further education college in the Country.

The financial position at City College is improving in line with plans, but there remains a strong case to ensure future sustainability through a partnership that will achieve further savings and efficiencies.

#### THE CASE FOR MERGER

#### The Context

The Boards of Northbrook College Sussex and City College Brighton and Hove have been giving consideration to working in partnership since early 2015 with the aim of creating a broader, more coherent and financially sustainable further education and skills offer for our combined communities. The two Boards have completed independent evaluations of their strategic options both of which concluded that there was a strong case for collaboration. There is also a strong cultural fit and curriculum complementarity between the two colleges. Existing relationships are strong.

Between September 2015 and May 2016, both Colleges participated in the first wave of the national, government-led programme of Area Based Reviews, which looked at post-16 education and skills provision across the 'Sussex Coast' region. One of the primary recommendations of the review was for:

"A merger between Northbrook College and City College Brighton and Hove, with a focus on the development of apprenticeships and higher level skills to meet local need"

Both City College and Northbrook College Boards of Governors approved the Area Review recommendation in early May 2016 and, by the end of May, the Boards had also approved a detailed business case for merger. Financial and legal due diligence was then carried out between June and August.

A Joint Working Group (JWG), comprising governors and senior staff from both colleges, has been set up by the Boards to oversee the process of merger. The JWG reports back, and makes recommendations, to the two Boards of Governors.

The colleges have developed this proposal in the context of the wider economic, educational and skills priorities in the Greater Brighton region.







#### **Our Vision**

- To transform the lives of young people and adults across the Region, through the provision of high quality vocational, professional and technical routes into employment
- To meet the economic priorities of the Greater Brighton Region, and the wider Coast2Capital Local Enterprise Partnership. The new college will play a central role in planning skills delivery and supporting economic development
- To invest in a broad curriculum establishing a sound educational footing of Mathematics, English and employability skills for all of our students
- To ensure that students, particularly those studying at entry level to level 3, are able to access courses close to where they live.
- To develop a range of vocational specialisms, at level 3 and above, which link to local economic priorities, including Creative, Digital and IT in Brighton and Hove and Worthing, Engineering at Shoreham and Worthing, and Construction at East Brighton

- To expand our Higher Education and Higher Technical offer, to allow clear opportunities for our students and apprentices to progress to degree level study, especially in our specialisms of Creative, Digital and IT and Engineering, together with Health, Care and Finance
- To place Apprenticeships and work-based learning at the heart
  of what we do, working with partners in the public, voluntary and
  community sector, youth services and local business to provide
  students with routes into employment and to plug skills gaps
- To collaborate with schools and colleges to make sure that all young people have access to impartial information, advice and guidance to enable them to make informed choices between vocational and academic pathways into higher education and work.



#### The Benefits

We believe that this proposed merger will benefit all of our stakeholders, especially our students, by creating a stronger, more resilient institution with the capacity and flexibility to respond to the challenges and opportunities that lie ahead.

Merging will enable us to deliver maximum value for money by creating greater efficiencies, eliminating unnecessary competition and increasing our ability to grow and diversify.

#### The benefits for our students

We share a real determination to provide the best possible learning experience by building on each College's strengths and creating the best opportunities for students to progress to work or higher education. We will do this through:

- Providing excellent teaching delivered by the staff who are occupational specialists as well as excellent teachers
- Giving students clear and impartial advice to enable them to make the best choices
- Providing a range of courses which are closely aligned with the current and future needs and priorities of employers
- Inspiring students who are disengaged from learning, and providing an inclusive and supportive environment for students with a range of needs
- Working with local businesses and other partners to provide our students with meaningful work experience and the curriculum and skills to make sure that they are ready for work
- Providing clear progression pathways through our curriculum from foundation to higher level, to enable students to continue their education with us
- Improving our facilities and developing an integrated, efficient, and stimulating learning environment across all five campuses.

- enhancing career opportunities and chances to specialise

- Provide a single point of contact for a wide-ranging workforce development offer to employers including traineeships, apprenticeships, commercial courses and bespoke training solutions.
